Training and services



Overview

UNMAS provides training and services for impacted communities and organizations working in explosive ordnance (EO) affected areas.

These include:

- Explosive Ordnance Risk Education (EORE) in impacted communities
- Explosive Hazard Awareness Training (EHAT)
- Information Management and Reporting Training
- Explosive Ordnance Threat Assessment
- Introduction to Humanitarian Mine Action (HMA)

Courses, services, and briefings can be provided on request, subject to UNMAS's capacity and available resources.

Explosive Ordnance Risk Education

These sessions provide Explosive Ordnance Risk Education (EORE) to communities and civilians, heightening their awareness of explosive ordnance (EO) risks and encouraging safer behaviour.

Areas (woredas) are prioritized based on an assessment of risk. In case of emergency, UNMAS may respond to requests from partners, subject to the availability of resources.

Objectives:

- Enhance awareness of the risk of EO
- Promote safer behaviour among the population in conflict-affected areas.

Target audience

Population in conflict-affected areas, focusing on at-risk groups, including children and internally displaced persons (IDPs).

Duration

Approximately forty-five minutes.



Explosive Hazard Awareness Training (EHAT)

This training aims to enhance participants' knowledge and awareness of explosive ordnance (EO) risk, and considerations when planning and working in EO affected areas.

The course integrates participatory learning with presentations, encompassing experiential reflections, and scenario-based activities.

Objectives:

- Enhance participants' knowledge and awareness of the risks of EO
- Introduce a basic understanding and recognition of the types of EO found in Ethiopia
- Prepare participants for the safe planning and delivery of operations in contaminated areas.

Target audience

NGOs, INGOs, UN AFPs, and Governmental Organizations.

Duration

Approximately one hour long.



Information Management and Reporting

This training aims to give the participants an understanding of the reporting process, why we use the systems we do, and practical experience in working with the tools.

The course covers the use of software for reporting, dashboards and web applications for data validation; as well as best practices in data management.

The content can be customised based on the needs of the requesting organisation.

Objectives:

- Foster understanding of the reporting processes among participants
- Provide hands-on experience in the use of reporting tools, dashboards and web applications
- Highlight best practices in data management.

Target audience

Field team leaders tasked with reporting on activities. Project managers and Information Management Officers (IMOs) responsible for monitoring and overseeing field operations.

Duration

One to two days, depending on the audience and content of the training.



Explosive Ordnance Threat Assessment

UNMAS Operations Officers based in Mekele, Shire, and Semera offer assistance in evaluating areas affected by explosive ordnance (EO), and supporting organisations in assessing the impact on their interventions.

They can participate in Field Assessment Missions, providing on-site technical advice on EO.

Objectives:

- Evaluate the impact of explosive ordnance on areas of intervention
- Provide on-site technical advice during Field Assessment Missions
- Conduct threat assessments in Woredas with reported EO contamination.

Who can request this support

NGOs, INGOs, UN AFPs who have a field presence in Northern Ethiopia, and whose field missions are affected by the presence of the Explosive Ordnance.

Duration

Assessment time varies depending on the request.

Duration


Approximately one hour.


