
The OAS in Focus

Control of Arms, Munitions and Explosives

- Based on Inter-American Convention (CIFTA)
- OAS assistance and capabilities
 - EOD training (locally and with Spain MOD)
 - Mobile SALW destruction capacity
 - Destruction of expired, deteriorating and excess munitions
 - Abandoned munitions clearance and area remediation
 - Assistance with physical security, stockpile management and transport
 - Marking / tracing equipment

Results

- Over 33,000 SALW destroyed
- Nearly 1,700 tons of munitions eliminated
- Over 400 national personnel trained in stockpile management and destruction
- 47 EOD technicians trained to IMAS level 3
