CWD Program Overview

Two Main Program Components

- Humanitarian Mine Action Activities that aim to reduce the social, economic and environmental impact of mines and UXO.
 - Mine risk education (MRE);
 - Humanitarian demining, i.e., mine and UXO survey, mapping, marking and clearance;
 - Survivor assistance, including rehabilitation and reintegration;
 - Stockpile destruction.

- Weapons and ammunition destruction
- Man-portable Air Defense Systems (MANPADS)
- Physical Security and Stockpile Management (PSSM)




