Mandate

Support the *DDR/SSR process* (weapons collection, registration and destruction)






Rehabilitation of ammunition and weapons storage facilities





UNMAS to replicate the successful project from the Ivory Coast

- UNMAS is prepared to immediately respond to the threats caused by ammunition and weapons systems stored unsafely.
- UNMAS is ready to provide technical support to BINUCA as well as to national authorities.





DONOR SUPPORT REQUIRED

- An estimated total of US\$ 1M (\$250,000 for immediate rapid response and \$750,000 for follow up) is required to provide countrywide rapid EOD response and begin with the rehabilitation of ammunition storage facilities for the first year.
- It is crucial that funds are available immediately after the establishment of a peacekeeping mission – donors are requested to provide support now to deploy an UNMAS mine action rapid response team.
