Introduction


- Civil and regional war from 60's to 90's
- The North Western regions bordering Thailand are contaminated by Landmines
- Eastern regions are contaminated mostly by ERW

- More than 2.75 millions tons of bomb were dropped from air plan during the regional conflicts









Institution and coordination


CMAA: establish in 2000



- Technical Working Group on Mine Action (TWG-MA):
 - A consultative mechanism between government and development partners and NGOs led activities
 - Promote Aid Effectiveness and the RGC's action Plan






United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL)


