A regional approach to mine action that works | Honduras 1995 - 2004

Guatemala

1997 - 2005

Since 1991:

- Over 200,000 landmines cleared
- More than a million stockpiled mines destroyed
- Over a million people in more than 1,500 affected communities educated about mine risks
- 1,500 landmine victims assisted

Quality Management



Control of Arms, Munitions and Explosives

- Based on Inter-american Convention (CIFTA)
- Offshoot from mine action successes
- Agreements with six Central American governments
- OAS assistance and capabilities
 - EOD training
 - Mobile SALW destruction capacity
 - Destruction of expired, deteriorating and excess munitions
 - Abandoned munitions clearance and area remediation
 - Assistance with physical security, stockpile management and transport
 - Marking / tracing equipment



Results 2007-2012





Guatemala

- 634 T ammunition destroyed
- 2,091 SALW destroyed
- 1 storage site remediated

El Salvador

- 1 storage site in remediation
- 2,078 SALW for destruction in Sep 12

Honduras

- 20 T small caliber ammunition destroyed
- 3,000 SALW for destruction in Jan 13

Nicaragua

- 946 T ammunition destroyed
- 82 hectares of farmland cleared of AXO

Costa Rica

- 32 T ammunition/pyrotechnics destroyed
- 1,609 SALW destroyed
