## SAFETY AND SECURITY

Keeping people safe is the central objective of most mine action activities

- Clearing areas affected by mines and ERW so that land can be used without injury
- Destroying explosive ordnance that can kill or maim if manipulated
- Preventing injury through risk education
- Building the capacity of security providers so that they safely use and store weapons and ammunition




## MINE ACTION WITHIN THE PROTECTION UMBRELLA

## DIGNITY, INTEGRITY AND EMPOWERMENT

Mine action provides vulnerable populations with enhanced choices, autonomy and addresses the blockages they may face with regards to their physical, psychosocial, economic, social and cultural considerations.

- Clearance and destruction of explosive ordnance to reclaim spaces and livelihoods possibilities
- RE to empower vulnerable populations to avoid danger
- Survivor/Victim Assistance to support scoio-economic reintegration and reconstruction of livelihoods.
