Activities

- Establish a CMAA mine action programme performance monitoring system that links human development and mine action.
- Training of Trainers (ToT) for the collection and reporting of the new set of indicators for the mine action sector.
- Strengthen the CMAA's international and national participation in relevant fora.
- Conduct an Impact Assessment of priority mine-ERW-impacted areas and villages in the target provinces to be cleared.
- Contract mine action services clear a minimum of 27 km² in areas located among the most affected and poorest provinces from the impact of mines/ERW by the CMAA.

Expected Outcomes

Support the government in maximizing mine action results on human development: (i) the development of performance monitoring systems: that links mine action to human development in a systematic manner and ensure gender disaggregated and poverty related indicators are factored in; (ii) land release activities: that in respect of gender equality principles would involve poor communities in responsible and effective land release, and contractors in effective and efficient use of new technologies.
