



Briefing on the occasion of the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action Saving Lives through Humanitarian Mine Action in Azerbaijan

Friday, 4 April 2025, 15:00-17:00, Conference Room 8, UNHQ

CONCEPT NOTE

BACKGROUND

Azerbaijan faces significant challenges due to landmines and explosive remnants of war (ERW), which affect more than 13% of the country's territory. Since November 2020, 388 people have become victims of landmines and ERWs (70 killed, 318 wounded). The total number of mine victims in Azerbaijan since 1991 has reached 3467 persons. There is a pressing need for an adequate level of practical support from the international community and enhanced partnership through technical, material and financial means, as well as innovative solutions for Azerbaijan's humanitarian demining efforts. The biennial UNGA resolution "Assistance in Mine Action" (78/70) and UNSC resolution 2365 (2017) call upon Member States and relevant UN entities to provide assistance for mine-affected countries. Likewise, the United Nations Mine Action Strategy (2024) and the United Nations Policy on Victim Assistance in Mine Action (2016) reaffirm such assistance as critical and lifesaving.

OBJECTIVE

On the occasion of the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action, the Permanent Mission of the Republic of Azerbaijan to the United Nations, in cooperation with the Center of Analysis of International Relations (AIR Center), will hold a briefing entitled "Saving Lives through Humanitarian Mine Action in Azerbaijan" on 4 April 2025. The event will highlight vital aspects of mine action in Azerbaijan, particularly those related to the humanitarian demining works, and the necessity of international assistance and innovative solutions in addressing this challenge. The discussion will explore the importance of humanitarian mine action to address the threat and risks of mines and ERWs to safety, health and lives of the civilian population, exposing the negative impact of landmine contamination on the achievement of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development Goals.
